Maria has worked in various clinical settings from acute care to public health. Currently she is the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Consultant at Centura Health. Maria is also an affiliate professor of nursing at Regis University, where she teaches Health Policy. She has been a health equity champion for over 10 years, supporting and advocating for the Latinx community in the Denver Metro area.

Her professional interests focus on the dignified care of underserved populations, and the use of Promotoras to improve care access for Latino communities. Maria is the past president of the Denver chapter of the National Association of Hispanic nurses and received the National Hispanic Nurse of the Year award in 2021 for her efforts to vaccinate and educate the Latino community during the Covid pandemic. In 2022 Maria received the prestigious Nightingale Award for her efforts to advance equity for Latino populations during the Covid pandemic.
